Rigid Closed Angle Low Profile Bead Installation Instructions

Product Overview


Trim-Tex Rigid Closed Angle Low Profile Bead is designed with a closed angle to ease the finishing of uneven framing. The smaller angle allows you to press the bead into place without splaying out the mud legs (as shown in Figure A&B.)

Installation Instructions

- 1. Cut the bead to length and dry fit over the corner while pressing the bead into place to ensure accurate installation.
- 2. For ultimate bond, spray a coat of 847 on the mud legs and the drywall. For single surface application, apply two medium coats to the drywall or the mud legs.
- 3. Install bead immediately and pressure the mud legs to the drywall. If the adhesive dries and there is no tack to it, apply additional coats of spray adhesive.
- 4. Once in position, press the nose of the bead into place to adjust for poor framing and staple the mud legs every 6"-8" with $\frac{1}{2}$ " long divergent staples (or closer as needed to ensure the legs sit proper.)
- 5. Mud as usual. Be sure to use All-Purpose or Multi-Purpose Compound. We do not recommend the use of Fast Setting Compounds. Add Mud-Max to your drywall compound for the ultimate performance. Prime and paint as usual

Quick Tip

For long runs with poor framing, snap a chalk line. Use a piece of the Closed Angle Bead to mark on the drywall where the chalk line should begin and end. Use the chalk line to position your bead for a straight installation.
